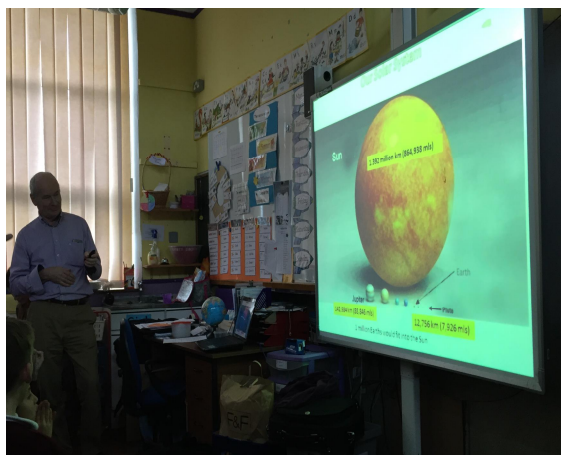
Special points of interest:
